City Seeks Public Support for 9/11 Memorial Triangle Fundraiser

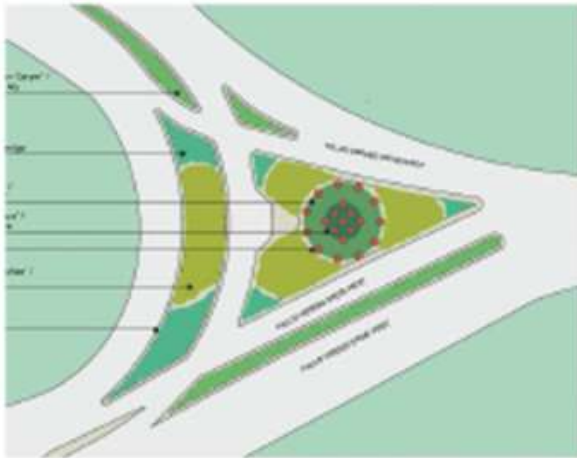


The 9/11 Memorial Triangle welcomes drivers entering and leaving Palos Verdes Estates along Palos Verdes Estates Drive.

Installed on September 12, 2011, the memorial was developed to honor the many civilians and public safety individuals who lost their lives on 9/11.

Through the years, the City has replaced frayed flags, maintained landscape and has always had long term plans to upgrade the memorial.

This year, the City is seeking to replace the PVC flag poles currently being used and replace them with 20-foot high commercial grade poles that are the proper and appropriate display for the American flag. The cost for this project is \$90,000 for 20 new poles.



The cost includes traffic control during construction, the installation of flag poles, construction surveying, wiring installation for new flagpoles, lights between pedestal and triangle and individual pole lights.

“We are proud to have a memorial that recognizes the civilians and public safety personnel who lost their lives,” said Ken Rukavina, Director of

Community Development and Public Works/City Engineer. “We are launching a campaign to help raise the funds we need to complete this project and we hope the public will join us.”
