### ARRESTS

**07-31-2025**                      **Court Order Violation and Drugs**                      **2300 BLK VIA ACALONES**

At approximately 7:40 AM, officers responded to a call and found a subject violating a restraining order. The subject was subsequently arrested. Officers found the person to be in possession of a controlled substance during the booking search.

**08-02-2025**                      **Weapon Arrest**                      **300 BLK PALOS VERDES DR W**

At approximately 12:10 AM, officers conducted a traffic stop and began an investigation. Officers conducted a vehicle search and found a concealed firearm. The driver was subsequently arrested.

### CRIMES

**07-28-2025**                      **Battery**                      **100 BLK VIA LAS VEGAS**

At approximately 2:20 PM, officers responded to a report of a battery that had just occurred between two parties that are known to each other. A known suspect had a verbal argument with the victim and punched them on the right cheek with a closed fist. The suspect then fled the scene.

**07-31-2025**                      **Forgery**                      **UNKNOWN**

Sometime between 7-21-25 and 7-30-25, an unknown suspect obtained victim's check by unknown means, altered it, and deposited/cashed it.

**08-01-2025**                      **Identity Theft**                      **UNKNOWN**

Sometime prior to 8-1-25, an unknown suspect obtained victim's personal identifying information by unknown means to fraudulently wire funds to another account.

**08-01-2025**                      **Suspected Residential Burglary Casing Camera**                      **1300 BLK VIA MARGARITA**

At 3:15 PM, officers responded to a report of a possible hidden camera that was located on private property. Officers located a pouch with a camera inside that is believed to be used by burglars to monitor resident's activity for casing purposes. Officers conducted a search and did not find any additional items, and the camera was recovered. The case is still under investigation.
