ARRESTS

03-16-2026 Drug and Alcohol Arrest GRANVIA ALTAMIRA & VIA PANORAMA

At approximately 4 PM, officers conducted a traffic stop and began an investigation. The passenger falsely identified themselves and was subsequently arrested for possession of concentrated marijuana, possession of alcohol as a minor, and failure to present a driver's license.

At approximately 7:30 PM, officers conducted a traffic stop and began an investigation. The driver was issued a misdemeanor citation for driving with a suspended license.

At approximately 1:30 PM, officers responded to a report of a traffic collision with no injuries. While responding, officers were notified that a vehicle left the scene. Sometime between 01-03-2026 and 03-19-2026, unknown suspect(s) obtained victim's check, altered it, and attempted to cash it.
